Arrival Day = Move-In day 1

• Arrival day on 12 January is Move-in day 1.

Note on Move-in day 2 18 January you are to go directly to University Housing. There is no Arrival Day at the Student Center on 18 January.

• Arrival day hours: <u>9-17:00</u>

If you arrive in Malmö later than 17.00 on Arrival Day, or at a later date, you will need to make an appointment with Housing. The International Office does not have access to your keys!



- *From where we can buy a sim card and what documents they might need?*
- Will we be provided Swedish SIM cards on arrival or is this something we have to organise ourselves? If so what is the best way?

The International Office will not be giving out any SIM cards. You can buy a SIM card at different shops here in Sweden (for example Pressbyrån). You will need your passport or other form of ID. EU students do not need to buy a new SIM card as they can use their own SIM card inside EU.



Question 2:

In the inventory list send for the students who are moving to Rönngården, it is specified that we should bring an ethernet cable and a router to get Wi-Fi. I'm not sure, what kind of router should we bring ? How are we going to install it ? Thank you for your answer.

A simple router will do. It is usually easy to install it. If you don't have one at home, you can easily find a router in Sweden. There are a lot of cheap options. Sometimes previous tenants leave their routers behind, so you might be able to get one for free. Contact your resident assistant when you are in Malmö or talk to other students for tips (e.g., Student Union members or student volunteers).





Is it okay if we only have a digital version of our European Health Insurance Card ? My health insurance says that it is adequate but to be sure, I would like to have also your opinion,.

Please consult the health insurance provider in your home country as they are the authority responsible for these issues.

Where do most Malmo students end up purchasing/renting their bikes? I know past emails have mentioned buying bikes secondhand/at an auction as well Malmo by bike, but was just curious what the majority of students end up doing.

Question 7:

Is there a possibility to buy a pre-paid creditcard in Sweden? I've looked it up but can't really find anything about it. In Belgium it is very common to buy one for travellers.

Unfortunately, no.

We strongly recommend talking to your bank in your home country to make sure that your bank card will work in Sweden.

It is vital that you take care of this matters before you come to Malmö. For example, talk to your bank at your home country and bring a credit card (note that previous students have had problems with using their debit cards.). You can also look into other options, such as Revolut.

Bring one winter jacket as it can get really cold in Malmö in January.
