

Local buses (green colored)

Please note that cash is not accepted on buses or trains!

The easiest way to pay for your ticket on the bus or train in the region is by using the app Skånetrafiken. On the city buses, you are also able to pay by card, provided that your card has a contactless paying option. If you prefer, there is also an alternative to buy a travel card. No matter which way you choose to pay, the price is the same. **Useful bus line:**

- Line 3 runs from bus stop
Celsiusgården (near Rönngården/
Celsiusgården)
to bus stop Orkanen (travel time approx.
15 mins)

Local Health Clinics

("vårdcentral")

In Sweden, every town is divided into different health care areas with local health clinics. Always call to make an appointment! Not all local health clinics offer the possibility to call back if you are calling from a non-Swedish number. Vårdcentralen Granen, situated on Grangatan 1, close to student housing, are able to call back.

Call 1177 to speak to a registered nurse for medical advice and get information about the nearest clinic if you need to see a physician. During office hours you are also able to contact the Student Health Services and receive medical advice from our registered nurse. Medicine and prescriptions

Pharmacies in Sweden are called "apotek." Prescription drugs are available at pharmacies. Painkillers and non-prescription drugs can be found at most supermarkets.

Most pharmacies are open 10.00 – 18.00 on weekdays and 10.00 – 15.00 on Saturdays. Apoteket at Bergsgatan 48 is open 08.00 – 22.00 every day.
